There are video-based and text-based materials on the web, as well as there's DVDs and CDs that you can access. We have put together, at my office at Teaching Research Institute, with Pat Sublet [assumed spelling] and some other colleagues, we've put together TBI Ed.org, and that website is very practical. It has things like so you need to develop an individual education plan for a child. What kinds of things do you need to make sure you include. We have forms there and lots of very practical, hands-on information for educators who are working with kids with brain injury.
